The CUP 2020 Survey is an instrument developed by the Council of University Presidents workgroup. This is a common set of questions that provides comparable information on NM university students' satisfaction with their educational experiences. NNMC adopted the survey when it joined the CUP in 2012. Prior surveys are available on Northern's Institutional Research survey website.

This survey was administered via SurveyMonkey to all graduating students. A total of 180 students received the survey by email between May 2020 and June 2020. Eighty-two students responded giving a 46% response rate. The results are as follows:







Weakness

- Rarely received feedback on work submitted. Just a letter grade on a transcript.
- Weakness: Way too much time spent on clinical hours at BSN level. Nurses who work full-time, especially days, would find this program a deal-breaker. Also, courses in public speaking and English Comp (both required) were a waste of time and money as they were very low-level."
- I often felt that the professors were not seeking to educate so much as to simply inform students what their opinions were on a particular topic. It was disingenuous and discouraging, not to mention frustrating.
- I really enjoyed my college experience and the teachers where awesome. The only two areas of training I saw that need more attention is shaving and performing a fade haircut. The program needs someone who has worked and has hands on experience as a barber to train those areas.
- The same Instructor for two important subjects was not good at teaching.
- I am a criminal justice major. I expected to learn things in relation to criminal justice and it seemed like I learned more about philosophy the entire time. We needed more law courses.
- Because of the closing of the school I feel that I missed out on learning everything I needed to prepare me for my state board tests. The teachers were not prepared to set up a well-organized

curriculum for the cosmetology and barbering program. Since the closing we also were not able to get our things from the salon to properly provide service on our mannequin heads.

- Lack of resources in the nursing department.
- I would have liked to have the Core Classes such as math, Science, etc. to be offered at different times in the late afternoon or evenings due to a lot of people are working during the morning and is harder to leave work for class. I know myself as a teacher, parent who works full time a was trying to complete my degree it would of been nice to have more times available. I really enjoyed the flexibility of the Teacher Education department with classes, I was able to do some weekend and evenings class which really helped a lot. I also kept my own record of classes that I needed to complete because my academic advisor was always changing or never kept in touch unless I contacted them.
- Fill the gap between Administration and students. People who have 3-5 figure salaries have NO
 Knowledge or experience with students. Staff and faculty who work with students receive
 peanuts for pay.
- I felt like there was a missing level of care between professors in my department and students. Some of the professors were not so understanding of student's situations and I often disliked having to be in an actual class setting because of it. I also had a lot of trouble with the Registrar's office and the Advisors in Admissions. I did everything on my own my entire college experience because of a lack of faith in those departments. I believe these departments can be overwhelmed with duties and it hurts students who need something in particular and they have to wait weeks or months to get their requests filled.
- Some of robotics stuff they have in the labs are limited and need more expertise to use. They currently do not have anyone who can work with that equipment and cannot provide a worthwhile experience for those in the robotics course."
- A weakness would be the amount of staff in the Engineering and IT department. A strength is the staff they do have are amazing.
- Provide a Native American center.
- My overall college experience was great. However, I wish the college would have sent out important emails with more time ahead of the actual event, not a couple days before. Also, it would have been nice to have our own building to do labs; a building for Environmental Science only maybe. Lastly, the elevator was never fixed in the library for two semesters straight, therefore it was hard for me to go to the top floor.

Q10. If you were able to make one significant change in the programs, services or environment for students at this institution, what would it be?

- Advisement.
- "An option for dorms to be implemented on campus. Living off campus takes some time to get use to in Espanola, so having the choice to be closer to the main campus is definitely better."
- Availability of classes in ECE
- Class availability was the only issue I faced but I worked it out and had awesome academic advisors along the way!
- Classes offered during both semesters.

- Constant review of the ability of instructors to impart information, listen to the students, take a survey of student opinion early in the season.
- For all the courses to be available because right now there are many courses that are not available for students to be able to complete their degree or certificate.
- Free tuition for all.
- Get Northern back to providing more vocational opportunities.
- Have more classes at different times to accommodate working individuals.
- Have more degree programs. Bring back wielding and automotive.
- Having another instructor to help in the nail, waxing, and facial room. Also changing the way the teacher takes our hours even when we are on class.
- I really liked the on campus learning but I know it is not cost effective due to lower admission rates.
- I think in the long run a larger availability of online programs would be something that benefits the student like myself. As a Public Servant working 40+ hours a week, I know that even the online program takes time management. There are many officers I know that only need 1 or 2 classes to obtain their degrees. They always relate to me how they wish they have time, but between kids, spouses, and work it isn't feasible to come to Northern for classes. With the availability of online courses for working adults and young mothers and fathers within Northern New Mexico, I believe that we might see an influx in not only students but working professionals.
- I think the school needs better-informed staff. Many times, I would ask questions and be passed around to multiple people before finding an answer. Also, it may be helpful to teach students how to register for classes on their own and have the ability to do more things independently so the Registrar and Admissions staff can help students more rapidly.
- I wasn't aware of any clubs or scholarships. Unless it was through my email. I would like to see those type of things be advertised more.
- I would not change anything because I receive all the help. I couldn't do it without program support that fast; the staff of the program believes in me.
- I wish there was more online classes.... I had to quit my job to go back to school because all the classes I needed weren't offered online which made it hard.
- I would honestly make another cafe in the college. When the cafe was in the library it was the best!
- I would organize the overall nursing department better. At times it was very unorganized.
- I would try to make all instructors available on campus a little more often.
- If I were able to make one significant change in the programs, services or environment first students at this institution it would be to have more in person classes and less online classes.
- If some professors were more classes were offered
- In the College of Education I would not change anything. Keep up the good work and please continue helping students like me achieve their goals.
- Make the services available to the students more obvious or announce it more. Some students are unaware of the services/programs that are at northern.
- More degree options (radiology)
- More ECE classes available every semester.

- More interaction between the school, staff and Peers
- More laboratory time
- More Psychology classes. I feel as though I took more classes in other fields than my own.
- Offering general education classes that are offered at night due to the fact that Childcare is during the day and we cannot leave work to go to class.
- Overall I wouldn't change anything about my experience at Northern it was absolutely amazing, the best experience of school I have ever had.
- Provide a Native American center.
- Reduce number of clinical hours required in complementary and alternative medical (CAM) fields for nurses at BSN level. This is very different from the clinical hours in the ADN program because in the ADN program, we are intended to become nurses and we practice nursing skills while doing our clinical hours (very valuable!). In contrast, at the BSN level, the clinical hours are not meant to help us become CAM therapists. Instead, we are simply observing and learning how to incorporate therapies or collaborate with other therapists. Forty-five hours of observation is a lot to squeeze in on top of other coursework, and I didn't feel it was worth it. I could have learned the same with far less observation time. I also believe that NNMC loses some great students because they do not want to or cannot give away 45 hours of their time instead, they will opt for Highlands or similar online BSN program that does not have the 45-hour clinical requirement.
- Student life and resources for the disadvantaged. A place to be and sense of belonging.
- Summer classes
- Supplemental instruction
- The advisor is a little hard to get ahold of
- The blackboard
- Too many changes in positions people coming and going frustrating
- Would offer another degree that covers IT directly not engineering, or certification of CompTIA.
